These release notes provide information about the syslog-ng Store Box release.

About this release

Welcome to syslog-ng Store Box. This document describes what is new in the latest version of syslog-ng Store Box (SSB).

This is a Feature Release, which means that it will be supported for 6 months after the original publication date and for 2 months after a succeeding Feature or LTS Release is published (whichever date is later). Note that only the last of the feature releases is supported - for example, when a new feature release comes out, the last one becomes unsupported.

New features

New features in SSB 6.2.0:

SNMP monitoring improvements

Version 6.2.0 of syslog-ng Store Box allows you to monitor additional parameters of SSB and the underlying operating system using SNMP, for example:

- Hardware RAID status and related information (for example, S.M.A.R.T)
- Software RAID status
- Information about the certificates used on the **Basic Settings > Management > SSL certificate** page
- Additional data is available about the HA state of SSB clusters.

Table 1: General known issues

Known Issue	Issue ID
<p>RSA-PSS certificates that use the RSASSA-PSS signature algorithm are currently not supported in SSB. Typically, the Active Directory - Certificate Services (AD CS) of Windows servers generate such certificates when using PKCS #1 v2.1 signatures. Do not upload such certificates. Uploading such certificates causes the SSB web interface to become inaccessible.</p> <p>One Identity recommends to configure your PKI systems to use an alternate signature format, for example, use the SHA256RSA signature algorithm instead.</p>
